

FOOD WEBS AND CHAINS

A FOOD WEB IS A SYSTEM OF INTERRELATED FOOD CHAINS WITHIN AN ECOLOGICAL COMMUNITY. A FOOD CHAIN IS A LINEAR NETWORK OF LINKS WITHIN A FOOD WEB WHEREBY, ENERGY AND NUTRIENTS MAY FLOW IN AN ECOSYSTEM.





Organisms in food webs are grouped into categories called trophic levels.


